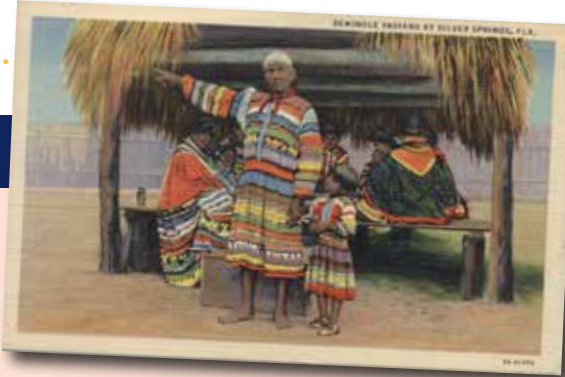

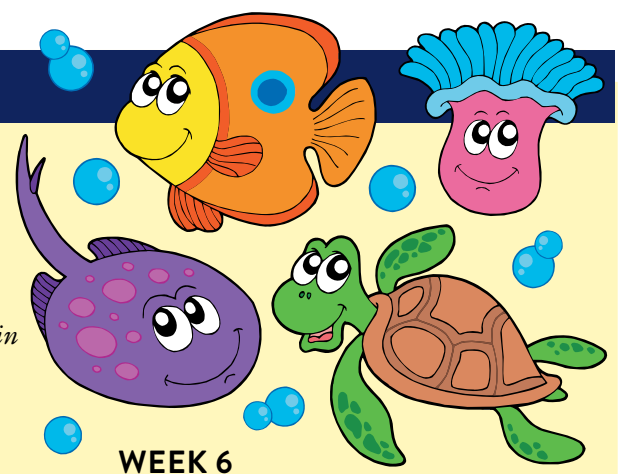
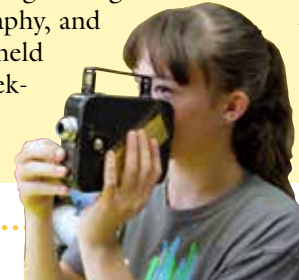


WEEK 4 (JULY 5-7) PAST & PRESIDENTS

From cave paintings to the Sistine Chapel to body art, history has shown us all kinds of examples of creativity. Let your senses soar as we explore what makes art so amazing.

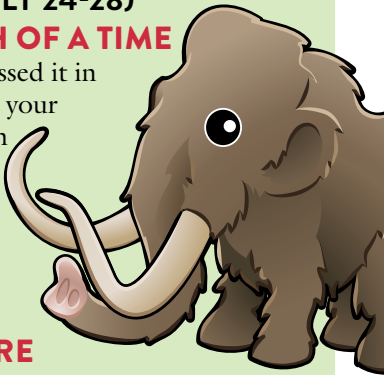


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
